S 1043. AGGREGATE TRUCK WEIGHT LIMITS. TO ADJUST THE WEIGHT LIMITS FOR TRUCKS TRANSPORTING AGGREGATES. Adds new GS 20-118(c)(16) to provide that subsections (b) (weight limitations) and (e) (penalties) do not apply to dump truck or dump trailer transporting bulk aggregates, if vehicle does not exceed maximum gross weight allowed in subsection (b). Adds new GS 20-118(e)(6) to provide that penalty for violating gross weight or axle-group weight by dump truck or dump trailer vehicle transporting bulk aggregate materials intrastate from site that does not have certified scale for weighing vehicle is one-half of amount it otherwise would be under subdivision (1) of section. Adds new GS 20-118(l) to provide that axle weight limits do not apply to dump truck or dump trailer transporting bulk aggregates on posted bridge, if vehicle does not exceed posted weight for bridge.

S 1043. AGGREGATE TRUCK WEIGHT LIMITS. Intro. 5/11/04. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Revises change to GS 20-118(c) as follows. Deletes new subsection 20-118(c)(16) and amends GS 20-118(c)(15) to include within excluded vehicles those transporting bulk soil, bulk rock, sand, sand rock, or asphalt millings from a site that does not have a certified scale for weighing the vehicle. Modifies new GS 20-118(e)(6) to provide that the penalty for violating the gross weight or axle-group weight by a dump truck or dump trailer vehicle transporting bulk soil, bulk rock, sand, sand rock, or asphalt millings intrastate from a site that does not have a certified scale for weighing is one-half of the amount it otherwise would be. Deletes new subsection GS 20-118(l). Adds a new subsection to GS 20-119(g) providing that no law enforcement officer shall issue a citation to a person for a violation if the officer is able to determine that the person has a permit but does not have the permit in his or her possession. No fines will be imposed on a person who was issued a citation, does not have a permit in his or her possession at the time, but submits evidence of a valid permit within 30 days. New subsection GS 20-199(g) becomes effective Jan. 1, 2005. Remainder effective when act becomes law.

SL 2004-145 (S 1043). AGGREGATE TRUCK WEIGHT LIMITS. AN ACT TO ADJUST THE WEIGHT LIMITS FOR TRUCKS TRANSPORTING CERTAIN MATERIALS AND TO PROVIDE THAT A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER CANNOT ISSUE A CITATION TO A PERSON FOR FAILING TO HAVE IN HIS POSSESSION A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR VEHICLES OF EXCESSIVE SIZE AND WEIGHT IF THE OFFICER DETERMINES THAT THE PERSON HAS BEEN ISSUED A PERMIT AND THE PERSON SUBMITS THE PERMIT WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF THE VIOLATION. Summarized in *Daily Bulletin* 5/11/04, 6/24/04, and 6/30/04. Enacted July 29, 2004. Section 3 is effective January 1, 2005. The remainder of this act is effective July 29, 2004.
