S 1259. PUBLIC WATER SERVICE WARRANTIES (NEW). Filed 3/21/07. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Amends GS 130A-315 to provide that a supplier of water regulated under this Article (North Carolina Drinking Water Act) is not deemed to provide any warranty under Article 2 of GS Chapter 25. Deletes language providing that a provider of water services regulated under the North Carolina Drinking Water Act is not deemed to be an insurer of the quality of the water provided, so long as the water meets or exceeds the enforceable standards of the North Carolina Drinking Water Act.

Changes the title to AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT WATER SUPPLIED BY A PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM REGULATED UNDER THE NORTH CAROLINA DRINKING WATER ACT IS NOT SUBJECT TO CERTAIN WARRANTIES.
