S 181. DRIVERS LICENSES CHANGE EXPIR./8 YEARS TO 65. Filed 2/16/09. TO INCREASE THE AGE CAP OF PERSONS RECEIVING AN EIGHT-YEAR DRIVERS LICENSE FROM FIFTY-FOUR YEARS OF AGE TO SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE.

Amends GS 20-7(f)(2) (regarding the duration of an original drivers license) and GS 20-7(f)(2a) (regarding the duration of a renewed drivers license) as the title indicates. Permits persons who are at least 18 years old, but less than 65 years old (was, less than 54 years old), to be issued or renewed a drivers license that expires on the licensee's birthday, in the eighth year after the license was issued or renewed. Effective January 1, 2010, and applies to any drivers license issued on or after that date.
