The General Assembly	of North Carolina enacts:	
SECTION 1	1. G.S. 115C-325(o) reads as rewritten:	
"(o) Resignation. –

	in the employee's personnel file of the written notice of the	
	superintendent's intention to recommend dismissal and (ii) the release	
	of the fact that the superintendent has reported this employee to DPI's	
	Licensure Section to prospective employers, upon request. The	
	provisions of G.S. 115C-321 shall not apply to the release of this	
	particular information.	
<u>C.</u>	The employee will be deemed to have voluntarily surrendered his or	
	her license pending an investigation by the State Board of Education	
	in a determination whether or not to seek action against the	
	employee's license. This license surrender shall not exceed 45 days	
	from the date of resignation. Provided further that the cessation of the license surrender shall not prevent the State Board of Education from	
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	taking any further action it deems appropriate. The State Board of Education shall initiate investigation within five working days of the	
	written notice from the superintendent and shall make a fina	
	decision as to whether to revoke or suspend the employee's certificate	
	within 45 days from the date of resignation.	
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	ld not resign without the consent of the superintendent unless he or she	
	given at least 30 days' notice. If the a teacher who is not recommended	
_	ismissal does resign without giving at least 30 days' notice, the board	



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1	may request that the State Board of Education revoke the teacher's ce	rtificate

4	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to	career
5	employees who resign on or after that date.	

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
