2	AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL
3	RESOURCES AND THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION OF THE
4	DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE TREASURER TO JOINTLY EVALUATE THE
5	POTENTIAL BENEFITS OF MONITORING THE FINANCIAL CONDITION OF
6	PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS, AS RECOMMENDED
7	BY THE LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMISSION ON WATER AND WASTEWATER
8	INFRASTRUCTURE.
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	SECTION 1. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the
11	Local Government Commission of the Department of State Treasurer shall jointly evaluate the
12	costs and benefits of requiring each public water system or wastewater system in the State to
13	demonstrate that the system raises sufficient revenue to cover the costs associated with proper
14	operation of the system, including the costs of maintenance, repair, and replacement of
15	collection, treatment, and distribution infrastructure.
16	(1) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
17	Government Commission shall specifically consider increasing their
18	oversight role to include the following actions:
19	a. Review grant applications submitted by a system to ensure that the
20	proposed grant match is funded from local revenues as opposed to
21	another grant.
22	b. Develop benchmarks that a system must meet to ensure that the
23	system is operating in a financially sound manner.
24	(2) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
25	Government Commission shall specifically evaluate the desirability of
26	requiring each public water system and wastewater system in the State to
27	conduct the following actions:
28	a. Submit an annual audit statement to State water and wastewater
29	infrastructure funding agencies to which the system is applying for
30	loan or grant funds for the purpose of reporting on the operation of
31	the system and to demonstrate whether the water and wastewater
32	rates of each system are sufficient to maintain system operations and
33	meet debt service obligations.

1	b. Implement remedial measures in the event that the audit statement
2	indicates a shortfall, including the submission of a written
3	explanation for the revenue shortfall from the governing body of the
4	system and the development of a plan to ensure that system revenues
5	cover system costs.
6	c. Maintain a capital reserve fund.
7	d. Provide notification to funding agencies when a system is failing to
8	operate in compliance with applicable State and federal water quality
9	standards.
10	(3) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
11	Government Commission shall identify and consider other actions or
12	measures that would improve the oversight of the financial condition of
13	public water systems and wastewater systems.
14	SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act, "public water system" has the same
15	meaning as in G.S. 130A-313(10) and "wastewater system" has the same meaning as in
16	G.S. 159G-20(25).
17	SECTION 3. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the
18	Local Government Commission shall jointly report their findings and recommendations to the
19	Legislative Study Commission on Water and Wastewater Infrastructure no later than November
20	1, 2010.
21	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
