SECTION 8. The General Statutes are amended by adding a new Chapter to read:

"Chapter 153C. "Uwharrie Regional Resources Act.

18 19 "§ 153C-1. Short title; findings; purpose.

> Short Title. - This Chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Uwharrie Regional Resources Act."

(b) Findings. – The General Assembly finds that:

- The beauty and abundant natural resources of the Uwharrie region of North (1)Carolina are prized by all North Carolinians. Millions of tourists travel to the Uwharrie region of North Carolina to see and experience the natural beauty of the region, including: the vistas near Uwharrie National Forest and Morrow Mountain State Park; scenic lakes and rivers including Badin, High Rock, and Tuckertown Lakes, and the Uwharrie, Yadkin, and Pee Dee Rivers; as well as nearby attractions including the North Carolina Zoological Park and the Seagrove area potteries. This tourism is vitally important to this region of the State.
- The federal government recognized the natural abundance and cultural <u>(2)</u> heritage of this region of North Carolina by purchasing tens of thousands of
