5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-415.10 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:		
7	" <u>(4b)</u>	Qualif	ied retired probation or parole certified officer An individual who
8			from service as a State probation or parole certified officer, other than
9		for rea	asons of mental disability, who has been retired as a probation or
10		-	certified officer two years or less from the date of the permit
11	application and who meets all of the following criteria:		
12		<u>a.</u>	Immediately before retirement, the individual met firearms training
13			standards of the Department of Correction and was authorized by the
14			Department of Correction to carry a handgun in the course of duty.
15		<u>b.</u>	The individual retired in good standing and was never a subject of a
16			disciplinary action by the Department of Correction that would have
17			prevented the individual from carrying a handgun.
18		<u>c.</u>	The individual has a vested right to benefits under the Teachers' and
19			State Employees' Retirement System of North Carolina established
20			under Article 1 of Chapter 135 of the General Statutes.
21		<u>d.</u>	The individual is not prohibited by State or federal law from
22			receiving a firearm."
23			G.S. 14-415.12A(a) reads as rewritten:
24	` '		o is a qualified sworn law enforcement officer or officer, a qualified
25	former sworn law enforcement officer officer, or a qualified retired probation or parole certified		
26	officer is deemed to have satisfied the requirement under G.S. 14-415.12(a)(4) that an applicant		
27	successfully complete an approved firearms safety and training course."		
28	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2010, and applies to		
29	probation and parole officers who retired before, on, or after December 1, 2010.
