6	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-4.01 reads as rewritten:		
7	"§ 20-4.01. Definitions.		
8	Unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply throughout this		
9	Chapter to the defined words and phrases and their cognates:

11	(28a) Plug-in electric vehicle. – A four-wheeled motor vehicle that meets each of		
12	the following requirements:		
13	<u>a.</u>	Is made by a manufacturer primarily for use on public	streets, roads,
14		and highways and meets National Highway T	raffic Safety
15		Administration standards included in 49 C.F.R. § 571.	
16	<u>b.</u>	Has not been modified from original manufacturer spec	ifications.
17	<u>c.</u>	Is rated at not more than 8,500 pounds unloaded	gross vehicle
18		weight.	
19	<u>d.</u>	Has a maximum speed capability of at least 65 miles pe	<u>r hour.</u>
20	<u>e.</u>	Draws electricity from a battery that has all of	the following
21		characteristics:	
22		<u>1.</u> <u>A capacity of not less than four kilowatt hours.</u>	
23		2. Capable of being recharged from an extern	nal source of
24		electricity.	
25		3. Acquired by the taxpayer on or after October 1,	<u>2010.</u>

28	"§ 20-146.2. Rush hour traffic lanes authorized.		
29	(a) HOV Lanes. – The Department of Transportation may designate one or more travel		
30	lanes as high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes on streets and highways on the State Highway		
31	System and cities may designate one or more travel lanes as high occupancy vehicle (HOV)		
32	lanes on streets on the Municipal Street System. HOV lanes shall be reserved for vehicles with		
33	a specified number of passengers as determined by the Department of Transportation or the city		
34	having jurisdiction over the street or highway. When HOV lanes have been designated, and		



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have been appropriately marked with signs or other markers, they shall be reserved for 1 2 privately or publicly operated buses, and automobiles or other vehicles containing the specified 3 number of persons. Where access restrictions are applied on HOV lanes through designated 4 signing and pavement markings, vehicles shall only cross into or out of an HOV lane at 5 designated openings. A motor vehicle shall not travel in a designated HOV lane if the motor 6 vehicle has more than three axles, regardless of the number of occupants. HOV lane restrictions 7 shall not apply to any of the following: 8 (1) motorcycles or Motorcycles. 9 vehicles Vehicles designed to transport 15 or more passengers, regardless of (2) 10 the actual number of occupants. 11 HOV lane restrictions shall not apply to emergency Emergency vehicles. As (3) 12 used in this subsection, subdivision, the term "emergency vehicle" means 13 any law enforcement, fire, police, or other government vehicle, and any 14 public and privately owned ambulance or emergency service vehicle, when 15 responding to an emergency. Plug-in electric vehicles as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(28a), regardless of the 16 (4) number of passengers in the vehicle. These vehicles must be able to travel at 17 18 the posted speed limit while operating in the HOV lane." 19 SECTION 3. G.S. 20-183.2(b) reads as rewritten: 20 "(b) Emissions. - A motor vehicle is subject to an emissions inspection in accordance 21 with this Part if it meets all of the following requirements: 22 . . . 23 (9) It is not a plug-in electric vehicle as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(28a)." 24 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
