Representative Jones

1 moves to amend the bill on page 1, lines 4 through 27 by rewriting those lines to read:

2 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 163-227.2(b) reads as rewritten:

3 "**§ 163-227.2. Alternate procedures for requesting application for absentee ballot;**  
4 "**one-stop" voting procedure in board office.**

6 (b) Not earlier than the ~~third~~second Thursday before an election, in which absentee  
7 ballots are authorized, in which a voter seeks to vote and not later than ~~4:00 P.M. on the last~~  
8 Saturday before that election, the voter shall appear in person only at the office of the county  
9 board of elections, except as provided in subsection (g) of this section. For the general election  
10 in November of even-numbered years on any weekday during that period one-stop voting,  
11 whether at the office of the county board of elections or at any site under subsection (g) of this  
12 section, shall be conducted either between the hours of 10:00 o'clock A.M and 6:00 o'clock  
13 P.M. or between the hours of 11:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M. A county board of  
14 elections shall conduct one-stop voting (i) for the general election in November of  
15 even-numbered years on the last Saturday before the election until 1:00 P.M. and may conduct  
16 it until 5:00 P.M. on that Saturday. two Saturdays before the election either between the hours  
17 of 10:00 o'clock A.M and 4:00 o'clock P.M. or between the hours of 11:00 o'clock A.M. and  
18 5:00 o'clock P.M., and (ii) for any other primary or election on the last Saturday before the  
19 primary or election either between the hours of 10:00 o'clock A.M and o'clock 4:00 P.M. or  
20 between the hours of 11:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M That voter shall enter the voting enclosure at  
21 the board office through the appropriate entrance and shall at once state his or her name and  
22 place of residence to an authorized member or employee of the board. In a primary election, the  
23 voter shall also state the political party with which the voter affiliates and in whose primary the  
24 voter desires to vote, or if the voter is an unaffiliated voter permitted to vote in the primary of a  
25 particular party under G.S. 163-119, the voter shall state the name of the authorizing political  
26 party in whose primary he wishes to vote. The board member or employee to whom the voter  
27 gives this information shall announce the name and residence of the voter in a distinct tone of  
28 voice. After examining the registration records, an employee of the board shall state whether  
29 the person seeking to vote is duly registered. If the voter is found to be registered that voter  
30 may request that the authorized member or employee of the board furnish the voter with an  
31 application form as specified in G.S. 163-227. The voter shall complete the application in the  
32 presence of the authorized member or employee of the board, and shall deliver the application  
33 to that person.
