  - The locum tenens agency does not interfere with or attempt to influence the **(2)** clinical judgment of a physician providing locum tenens services."

**SECTION 2.** Insurers shall establish within 180 days after the effective date of this act the process required by G.S. 58-3-231, as enacted by this act.

**SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2011.

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
