State Government Business Intelligence. - The State shall initiate across State 12 (a) 13 agencies, departments, and institutions a data integration and data sharing initiative that is not 14 intended to replace transactional systems, but is instead intended to leverage the data from 15 those systems for enterprise-level State business intelligence. 16 Creation of Initiative. – In carrying out the purposes of this section, the <u>(1)</u> 17 Office of State Controller shall conduct an ongoing, comprehensive 18 evaluation of State data analytics projects and plans in order to identify data 19 integration and business intelligence opportunities that will generate greater 20 efficiencies in, and improved service delivery by, State agencies, 21 departments, and institutions. The Office of State Controller may partner 22 with current vendors and providers to assist in the initiative. However, to 23 limit the cost to the State, the Office of the State Controller shall use current licensing agreements wherever feasible. 24 25 (2) 26 27 Carolina. 28 <u>(3)</u> Governance. - The State Controller shall lead the initiative established 29

- Application to State government. The initiative shall include all State agencies, departments, and institutions, including The University of North

The Chief Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court and the Legislative Services Commission each shall designate an officer or agency to advise and assist the State Controller with respect to implementation of the initiative in their respective branches of government. The judicial and legislative branches shall fully cooperate in the initiative mandated by this section in the same manner as is required of State agencies.
- Government Business Intelligence Competency Center. (b)
 - (1) GBICC established. - There is established in the Office of the State Controller the Government Business Intelligence Competency Center (GBICC). GBICC shall assume the work, purpose, and resources of the current data integration effort in the Office of the State Controller and shall otherwise advise and assist the State Controller in the management of the initiative. The State Controller shall make any organizational changes necessary to maximize the effectiveness and efficiency of GBICC.
 - Powers and duties of the GBICC. The State Controller shall, through the (2) GBICC, do all of the following:
 - Continue and coordinate ongoing enterprise data integration efforts, <u>a.</u> including:
 - The deployment, support, technology improvements, and <u>1.</u> expansion for CJLEADS.
 - The pilot and subsequent phase initiative for NC FACTS. <u>2.</u>
 - Individual-level student data and workforce data from all <u>3.</u> levels of education and the State workforce.

Savings resulting from the cancellation of 27 projects, software, and licensing, as well as any other savings from the initiative, shall be 28 29 returned to the General Fund and shall remain unexpended and unencumbered until 30 appropriated by the General Assembly in a subsequent fiscal year. It is the intent of the General 31 Assembly that expansion of the initiative in subsequent fiscal years be funded with these 32 savings and that the General Assembly appropriate funds for projects in accordance with the 33 priorities identified by the Office of the State Controller in Phase I of the initiative. 34 Reporting. – The Office of the State Controller shall: (e) 35 Submit and present quarterly reports on the implementation of Phase I of the (1) 36 initiative and the plan developed as part of that phase to the Chairs of the 37 Representatives Appropriations and Senate 38 Budget/Appropriations Committees, to the Joint Legislative Oversight 39 Committee on Information Technology, and to the Fiscal Research Division 40 of the General Assembly. The State Controller shall submit a report prior to implementing any improvements, expending funding for expansion of 41 42 existing business intelligence efforts, or establishing other projects as a result of its evaluations, and quarterly thereafter, a written report detailing 43 44 progress on, and identifying any issues associated with, State business 45 intelligence efforts. Report the following information as needed: 46 (2) 47 Any failure of a State agency to provide information requested 48 pursuant to this section. The failure shall be reported to the Joint 49 Legislative Committee on Information Technology and to the Chairs 50 of the House of Representatives Appropriations and Senate Base 51 Budget/Appropriations Committees.

b. Any additional information to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology that is requested by those entities.

(f) Data Sharing. –

- (1) General Duties of All State Agencies. The head of each State agency, department, and institution shall do all of the following:
 - a. Grant the Office of the State Controller access to all information required to develop and support State business intelligence applications pursuant to this section. The State Controller and the GBICC shall take all necessary actions and precautions, including training, certifications, background checks, and governance policy and procedure, to ensure the security, integrity, and privacy of the data in accordance with State and federal law and as may be required by contract.
 - <u>b.</u> <u>Provide complete information on the State agency's information technology, operational, and security requirements.</u>
 - c. Provide information on all of the State agency's information technology activities relevant to the State business intelligence effort.
 - <u>d.</u> <u>Forecast the State agency's projected future business intelligence information technology needs and capabilities.</u>
 - e. Ensure that the State agency's future information technology initiatives coordinate efforts with the GBICC to include planning and development of data interfaces to incorporate data into the initiative and to ensure the ability to leverage analytics capabilities.
 - f. Provide technical and business resources to participate in the initiative by providing, upon request and in a timely and responsive manner, complete and accurate data, business rules and policies, and support.
 - g. <u>Identify potential resources for deploying business intelligence in their respective State agencies and as part of the enterprise-level</u> effort.
 - h. Immediately seek any waivers and enter into any written agreements that may be required by State or federal law to effectuate data sharing and to carry out the purposes of this section, as appropriate.

(2) Specific Requirements. –

- a. The State Controller and the GBICC shall enhance the State's business intelligence through the collection and analysis of data relating to workers' compensation claims for the purpose of preventing and detecting fraud, as follows:
 - 1. The North Carolina Industrial Commission shall release to GBICC, or otherwise provide electronic access to, all data requested by GBICC relating to workers' compensation insurance coverage, claims, appeals, compliance, and enforcement under Chapter 97 of the General Statutes.
 - 2. The North Carolina Rate Bureau (Bureau) shall release to GBICC, or otherwise provide electronic access to, all data requested by GBICC relating to workers' compensation insurance coverage, claims, business ratings, and premiums under Chapter 58 of the General Statutes. The Bureau shall be immune from civil liability for releasing information pursuant

1				to this subsection, even if the information is erroneous,
2				provided the Bureau acted in good faith and without
3				malicious or willful intent to harm in releasing the
4				information.
5			<u>b.</u>	The Department of Commerce, Division of Employment Security
6				(DES), shall release to GBICC, or otherwise provide access to, all

8				coverage, claims, and business reporting under Chapter 96 of the
