1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO INCREASE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE SEED LAW. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 4 SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 106-277.19 reads as rewritten: 5 "§ 106-277.19. Revocation Revocation, suspension, or refusal of license for cause; 6 hearing; appeal. 7 In accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the Commissioner is 8 authorized to suspend any seed license issued for a period not to exceed three years, revoke any seed license issued, or to refuse to issue a seed license to any person as hereinafter provided, 9 10 upon satisfactory proof that said person has repeatedly violated any of the provisions of this any of the rules and regulations made and promulgated adopted 11 Article or thereunder.thereunder; provided that no license shall be revoked or refused until the person 12 shall have first been given an opportunity to appear at a hearing before the Commissioner. Any 13 person who is refused a license, or whose license is revoked by any order of the Commissioner, 14 may appeal within 30 days from said order to the Superior Court of Wake County or the 15 superior court of the county of his residence." 16 SECTION 1.(b) G.S. 106-277.24 reads as rewritten: 17 18 "§ 106-277.24. Penalty for violations. 19 Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Article or any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor and upon 20 conviction thereof shall only pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00).ten 21 22 thousand dollars (\$10,000). In determining the amount of the fine, the court shall consider the 23 retail value of the seed sold in violation of the law, and in cases involving the unlawful sale of

24 seed protected under the federal Plant Variety Protection Act, the court shall order the payment 25 of restitution to any injured party for any losses incurred as a result of the unlawful sale."

26 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2013, and applies to violations committed on or after that date.
