It also authorizes the holder 21 of the permit to ship malt beverages, unfortified wine, and fortified wine in 22 closed containers to individual purchasers inside and outside the State. 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SECTION 2. The ABC Commission shall adopt rules dealing with sanitation of growlers by January 1, 2014.

authorized to sell unfortified wine for consumption on the premises, provided that the sale of wine for consumption on the premises does not

exceed forty percent (40%) of the establishment's total sales for any 30-day

period. The holder of a wine-tasting permit not engaged in the preparation or

sale of food on the premises is not subject to Part 6 of Article 8 of Chapter
