Short Title: Metal Theft Statute Amendments. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: April 4, 2013 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO MAKE VARIOUS AMENDMENTS TO THE STATUTES THAT REGULATE SECONDARY METALS RECYCLERS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 66-420 reads as rewritten: "§ 66-420. Definitions. The following definitions apply in this Part: Cash card system. — A system of payment-that captures a photograph of a payment recipient and that provides payment in cash or in a form other than eash. cash and that when providing payment in the form of cash (i) captures a photograph of the seller at the time payment is received and (ii) uses an automated cash dispenser, including, but not limited to, an automated teller machine. (1a) Copper. — Nonferrous metals, including, but not limited to, copper wire, copper clad steel wire, copper pipe, copper bars, copper sheeting, copper tubing and pipe fittings, and insulated copper wire. The term shall not include brass alloys, bronze alloys, lead, nickel, zinc, or items not containing a significant quantity of copper. Fixed site. — A site occupied by a secondary metals recycler as the owner of (2) the site or as a lessee of the site under a lease or other rental agreement providing for occupation of the site by a nonferrous metals purchaser for a total duration of not less than 364 days. Law enforcement officer. — Any duly constituted law enforcement officer (3) of the State or of any municipality or county. Nonferrous metals. — Metals not containing significant quantities of iron or (4) steel, including, but not limited to, copper, copper wire, copper clad steel wire, copper pipe, copper bars, copper sheeting, aluminum other than aluminum cans, a product that is a mixture of aluminum and copper, catalytic converters, lead-acid batteries, and stainless steel beer kegs or containers. The term shall not include precious metals as defined and regulated in Part 2 of this Article. Nonferrous metals purchaser. — A secondary metals recycler who (5) purchases, gathers, or obtains nonferrous metals. Permit. — A permit issued pursuant to G.S. 66-426(a). (6) Regulated metals property. — All ferrous and nonferrous metals. (7)
