Sponsors: Referred to: April 4, 2013 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO CREATE THE NORTH CAROLINA MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMISSION. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. The North Carolina Advisory Commission on Military Affairs is 4 5 hereby abolished. 6 **SECTION 2.** Chapter 127C of the General Statutes reads as rewritten: 7 "Chapter 127C. 8 "Advisory Commission on Military Affairs. North Carolina Military Affairs Commission. 9 "§ 127C-1. Creation of the North Carolina Advisory Commission on Military 10 Affairs. Commission established; purpose; transaction of business. Establishment. - There is established the North Carolina Military Affairs 11 (a) Commission. The Commission shall be established within the Office of the Governor. The 12 Department of Commerce is responsible for organizational, budgetary, and administrative 13 14 purposes. 15 Purpose. - The Commission shall provide advice, counsel, and recommendations to (b) the Governor, the General Assembly, the Secretary of Commerce, and other State agencies on 16 initiatives, programs, and legislation that will continue and increase the role that North 17 18 Carolina's military installations, the National Guard, and Reserves play in America's defense 19 strategy and the economic health and vitality of the State. The Commission is authorized to: Coordinate and provide recommendations to the Governor, General 20 (1)Assembly, and State agencies to protect North Carolina's military 21 22 installations from incompatible development, encroachment, or other initiatives that could result in degradation or restrictions to military 23 operations, training ranges, or low level routes. 24 25 Cooperate with military installations to facilitate the military mission, (2)training, and continued presence of major military installations in the State, 26 and notify the commanding military officer of a military installation and the 27 governing body in affected counties and municipalities of any economic 28 development or other projects that may impact military installations. 29 Identify and support ways to promote quality of life for military members 30 (3) 31 and their families, such as providing a sound infrastructure, affordable 32 housing, affordable education, and transition support into North Carolina's workforce for military members and their families, military retirees, and 33 34 veterans.
