1 moves to amend the bill on page 1, line 5, by rewriting the line to read:

2 "PREGNANCIES, AND TO PROVIDE SUCH INFORMATION TO CHARTER,
3 NONPUBLIC, AND HOME SCHOOL STUDENTS."; and

on page 2, lines 2-3, by adding between those lines the following new sections to read:

"SECTION 1.1. G.S. 115C-238.29F(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) Health and Safety Standards. – A charter school shall meet the same health and 8 safety requirements required of a local school administrative unit. The Department of Public 9 Instruction shall ensure that charter schools provide parents and guardians with information 10 about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines at the beginning of every 11 school year. This information shall include the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal 12 meningitis and influenza are spread and the places where parents and guardians may obtain 13 additional information and vaccinations for their children.

The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that charter schools provide parents 14 15 and guardians with information about cervical cancer, cervical dysplasia, human papillomavirus, and the vaccines available to prevent these diseases. This information shall be 16 provided at the beginning of the school year to parents of children entering grades five 17 18 thoughthrough 12. This information shall include the causes and symptoms of these diseases, how they are transmitted, how they may be prevented by vaccination, including the benefits 19 20 and possible side effects of vaccination, and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional information and vaccinations for their children. 21

The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that charter schools provide students
 in grades seven through 12 with information annually on the preventable causes of preterm
 birth in subsequent pregnancies, including induced abortion, smoking, alcohol consumption,
 the use of illicit drugs, and inadequate prenatal care.

The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that charter schools provide students in grades nine through 12 with information annually on the manner in which a parent may lawfully abandon a newborn baby with a responsible person, in accordance with G.S. 7B-500.

The Department of Public Instruction shall also ensure that the guidelines for individual diabetes care plans adopted by the State Board of Education under G.S. 115C-12(31) are implemented in charter schools in which students with diabetes are enrolled and that charter schools otherwise comply with the provisions of G.S. 115C-375.3."

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### SECTION 1.2. G.S. 115C-548 reads as rewritten:

#### "§ 115C-548. Attendance; health and safety regulations.

3 Each private church school or school of religious charter shall make, and maintain annual 4 attendance and disease immunization records for each pupil enrolled and regularly attending 5 classes. Attendance by a child at any school to which this Part relates and which complies with 6 this Part shall satisfy the requirements of compulsory school attendance so long as the school 7 operates on a regular schedule, excluding reasonable holidays and vacations, during at least 8 nine calendar months of the year. Each school shall be subject to reasonable fire, health and 9 safety inspections by State, county and municipal authorities as required by law.

10 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall ensure that materials are provided to these schools so that they can provide parents and guardians with 11 12 information about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines at the beginning of every school year. This information may be provided electronically or on the Division's Web 13 14 page. This information shall include the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal meningitis 15 and influenza are spread and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional 16 information and vaccinations for their children.

17 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall also ensure that 18 materials are provided to these schools so that they can provide parents and guardians with 19 information about cervical cancer, cervical dysplasia, human papillomavirus, and the vaccines 20 available to prevent these diseases. This information may be provided electronically or on the 21 Division's Web page. This information shall include the causes and symptoms of these 22 diseases, how they are transmitted, how they may be prevented by vaccination, including the 23 benefits and possible side effects of vaccination, and the places where parents and guardians 24 may obtain additional information and vaccinations for their children.

25 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall also ensure that 26 information is available to these schools so that they can provide information annually on the 27 preventable causes of preterm birth in subsequent pregnancies, including induced abortion, smoking, alcohol consumption, the use of illicit drugs, and inadequate prenatal care. 28

29 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall also ensure that 30 information is available to these schools so that they can provide information on the manner in 31 which a parent may lawfully abandon a newborn baby with a responsible person, in accordance 32 with G.S. 7B-500."

SECTION 1.3. G.S. 115C-556 reads as rewritten:

#### 34 "§ 115C-556. Attendance; health and safety regulations.

35 Each qualified nonpublic school shall make, and maintain annual attendance and disease 36 immunization records for each pupil enrolled and regularly attending classes. Attendance by a 37 child at any school to which this Part relates and which complies with this Part shall satisfy the 38 requirements of compulsory school attendance so long as the school operates on a regular 39 schedule, excluding reasonable holidays and vacations, during at least nine calendar months of the year. Each school shall be subject to reasonable fire, health and safety inspections by State, 40 41 county and municipal authorities as required by law.

42 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall ensure that materials are provided to each qualified nonpublic school so that the school can provide parents 43



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and guardians with information about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines at the beginning of every school year. This information may be provided electronically or on the Division's Web page. This information shall include the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal meningitis and influenza are spread and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional information and vaccinations for their children.

#### 25 "§ 115C-565. Requirements exclusive.

26 No school which complies with this Part shall be subject to any other provision of law 27 relating to education except requirements of law respecting immunization. The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall provide to home schools 28 29 information about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines. This information 30 may be provided electronically or on the Division's Web page. The information shall include 31 the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal meningitis and influenza are spread and the 32 places where parents and guardians may obtain additional information and vaccinations for 33 their children.

34 The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall also provide to 35 home schools information about cervical cancer, cervical dysplasia, human papillomavirus, and the vaccines available to prevent these diseases. This information may be provided 36 37 electronically or on the Division's Web page. This information shall include the causes and 38 symptoms of these diseases, how they are transmitted, how they may be prevented by 39 vaccination, including the benefits and possible side effects of vaccination, and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional information and vaccinations for their 40 41 children.

42 <u>The Division of Nonpublic Education, Department of Administration, shall also provide to</u> 43 home schools information on the preventable causes of preterm birth in subsequent



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- 1 pregnancies, including induced abortion, smoking, alcohol consumption, the use of illicit drugs,
- and inadequate prenatal care. This information may be provided electronically or on the
