moves to amend the bill on page 1, lines 8-21, by deleting those lines and substituting the following:

- "(1) Has earned a specified minimum of 48 semester hours or 72 quarter minimum of credit hours of graduate training as defined by the Board, including a master's degree in counseling or a related field from an institution of higher education that is: (i) a regionally accredited institution of higher education regionally accredited or (ii) accredited by an organization recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation, as follows:
 - <u>a.</u> <u>ifIf</u> the applicant enrolled in the master's program before July 1, 2009;2009, a minimum of 48 semester hours or 72 quarter minimum of credit hours.
 - b. If the applicant enrolled in the master's program before July 1, 2013, but after June 30, 2009, a minimum of 54 semester hours or 81 quarter credit hourshours.
 - c. If the applicant enrolled in the master's program after June 30, 2013, a minimum of 60 semester hours or 90 quarter credit hours.—of graduate training as defined by the Board, including a master's degree in counseling or a related field from a regionally accredited institution of higher education if the applicant enrolled in the master's program before July 1, 2013, but after June 30, 2009; or a minimum of 60 semester hours or 90 quarter credit hours of graduate training
