A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, EMERGENCY 3 PERSONNEL, AND MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY EMPLOYEES TO OPERATE 4 UTILITY VEHICLES ON SOME PUBLIC HIGHWAYS AND TO MODIFY THE 5 MOVE-OVER LAW TO INCLUDE VEHICLES BEING USED IN THE COLLECTION 6 OF REFUSE, SOLID WASTE, OR RECYCLING. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1. G.S. 20-171.23 reads as rewritten: 9 "§ 20-171.23. Motorized all-terrainall terrain vehicles of law enforcement officers and 10 fire, rescue, and emergency medical services permitted on certain highways. Law enforcement officers acting in the course and scope of their duties may operate 11 (a) motorized all terrain vehicles, as defined in G.S. 14-159.3(b) and all terrain vehicles owned or 12 leased by the agency, or under the direct control of the incident commander, on: (i) public 13 highways where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less; and (ii) nonfully controlled access 14 15 highways with higher speeds for the purpose of traveling from a speed zone to an adjacent speed zone where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less. 16 Fire, rescue, and emergency medical services personnel acting in the course and 17 (b) scope of their duties may operate motorized all-terrain vehicles, as defined in 18 G.S. 14-159.3(b) all terrain vehicles and owned or leased by fire, rescue, or emergency medical 19 services departments, or under the direct control of the incident commander, on: (i) public 20 21 highways where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less; and (ii) nonfully controlled access highways with higher speeds for the purpose of traveling from a speed zone to an adjacent 22 23 speed zone where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less. 24 This Part and all other State laws governing the operation of all-terrainall terrain (c) 25 vehicles apply to the operation of all-terrainall terrain vehicles authorized by this section. 26 An all-terrainall terrain vehicle operated pursuant to this section shall be equipped (d) 27 with operable front and rear lights and a horn. A person operating an all terrainall terrain vehicle pursuant to this section shall 28 (e) 29 observe posted speed limits and shall not exceed the manufacturer's recommended speed for the 30 vehicle.

(f) A person operating an <u>all-terrainall terrain</u> vehicle pursuant to this section shall
carry an official identification card or badge.
