1 moves to amend the PCS on Page 18, Lines 37-38, by inserting between the lines a new section  
2 to read:

3 **"GRANTS FOR BODY-WORN VIDEO CAMERAS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT**  
4 **AGENCIES**

5 **SECTION 6.12.(a)** The appropriation to a Reserve for Pending Legislation in this  
6 act is hereby reduced by two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in  
7 nonrecurring funds for the 2015-2016 fiscal year and by two million five hundred thousand  
8 dollars (\$2,500,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2016-2017 fiscal year.

9 **SECTION 6.12.(b)** Of the funds appropriated in this act, the sum of two million  
10 five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2015-2016 fiscal year  
11 and the sum of two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in nonrecurring funds  
12 for the 2016-2017 fiscal year shall be used to establish a reserve in the Office of State Budget  
13 and Management to provide matching grants to local and county law enforcement agencies to  
14 purchase and place into service body-worn video cameras and for training and related expenses.  
15 The grant fund shall be administered by the Office of State Budget and Management and that  
16 Office, in consultation with the Governor's Crime Commission, shall develop guidelines and  
17 procedures for the administration and distribution of grants to those agencies. These guidelines  
18 and procedures shall include the following requirements and limitations:

- 19 (1) The maximum grant amount shall not exceed one hundred thousand dollars  
20 (\$100,000).
- 21 (2) Recipient law enforcement agencies shall be required to provide two dollars  
22 (\$2.00) of local funds for every one dollar (\$1.00) of grant funds received.
- 23 (3) Grantees shall be required to have appropriate policies and procedures in  
24 place governing the operation of body-worn cameras and the proper storage  
25 of images recorded with those cameras.

26 **SECTION 6.12.(c)** The Office of State Budget and Management shall submit the  
27 following reports to the Chairs of the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and  
28 Public Safety and to the Chairs of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees on Justice  
29 and Public Safety:

- 30 (1) No later than October 1, 2015, a report on the guidelines and procedures that  
31 will govern distribution and administration of grant funds distributed  
32 pursuant to this section.

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1 (2) No later than August 1, 2016, a report on the grant funds distributed  
2 pursuant to this section during the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

3 **SECTION 6.12.(d)** Definition. – The term "body-worn camera" means an  
4 operational video camera, including a microphone or other mechanism for allowing audio  
5 capture, affixed to a law enforcement officer's uniform and positioned in a way that allows the  
6 video camera to capture interactions the law enforcement officer has with the public."; and
