(Public) Sponsors: Referred to: March 5, 2015 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO REGULATE THE USE OF AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER 3 SYSTEMS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 6 Article to read: 7 "Article 3D. 8 "Automatic License Plate Reader Systems. 9 "<u>§ 20-183.22.</u> Definitions. 10 The following definitions apply in this Article: Automatic license plate reader system. - A system of one or more mobile or 11 (1)fixed automated high-speed cameras used in combination with computer 12 algorithms to convert images of license plates into computer-readable data. 13 This term shall not include a traffic control photographic system, as that 14 term is defined in G.S. 160A-300.1(a), or an open road tolling system, as 15 that term is defined in G.S. 136-89.210(3). 16 Law enforcement agency. - Any agency or officer of the State of North 17 (2)18 Carolina or any political subdivision thereof who is empowered by the laws of this State to conduct investigations or to make arrests and any attorney, 19 including the Attorney General of North Carolina, authorized by the laws of 20 21 this State to prosecute or participate in the prosecution of those persons arrested or persons who may be subject to civil actions related to or 22 23 concerning an arrest. 24 "§ 20-183.23. Regulation of use. Any State or local law enforcement agency using an automatic license plate reader 25 (a) system must adopt a written policy governing its use before the automatic license plate reader 26 system is operational. The policy shall address all of the following: 27 28 Databases used to compare data obtained by the automatic license plate (1)29 reader system. 30 Data retention. (2)31 (3) Sharing of data with other law enforcement agencies. Training of automatic license plate reader system operators. 32 (4)33 Supervisory oversight of automatic license plate reader system use. (5) 34 (6)Internal data security and access.
