7	one additional six-month period. The holder of a motorcycle learner's permit may not drive a

29 30	headlight beams in such manner as shall not project a glaring or dazzling light to persons within a distance of 500 feet in front of such headlamp. Every new motor vehicle, other than a

32	multiple-beam road-lighting equipment shall be equipped with a beam indicator, which shall be						
33	lighted whenever the uppermost distribution of light from the headlamps is in use, and shall not						
34	otherwise be lighted. Said indicator shall be so designed and located that when lighted it will be						
35	readily visible without glare to the driver of the vehicle so equipped. For purposes of this
