and inclusion of the school's growth score reduces the school's performance score and grade, a

school may choose to use the school achievement score solely to calculate the performance score

and grade. For all schools, the total school performance score shall be converted to a 100-point

scale and used to determine a school performance grade based on the following scale:

- A school performance score of at least 90 is equivalent to an overall school (1) performance grade of A.
- A school performance score of at least 80 is equivalent to an overall school (2) performance grade of B.
- A school performance score of at least 70 is equivalent to an overall school (3) performance grade of C.
- A school performance score of at least 60 is equivalent to an overall school (4) performance grade of D.
- A school performance score of less than 60 points is equivalent to an overall (5) school performance grade of F."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.
