Sponsors: Referred to: March 27, 2017 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF FULLY AUTONOMOUS MOTOR 2 3 VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF THIS STATE. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 SECTION 1. G.S. 20-4.01(25) reads as rewritten: 6 "(25) Operator. – A person (i) in actual physical control of a vehicle which is in 7 motion or which has the engine running.running or (ii) who causes a fully 8 autonomous vehicle, as defined in G.S. 20-399, to move with the automated driving system, as defined in G.S. 20-399, engaged. The terms "operator" 9 10 and "driver" and their cognates are synonymous." SECTION 2. G.S. 20-8 reads as rewritten: 11 12 "§ 20-8. Persons exempt from license. The following are exempt from license hereunder: 13 14 15 (8) A fully autonomous vehicle with the automatic driving system engaged or the operator of a fully autonomous vehicle with the automated driving 16 system engaged.
