1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE REMEDIES AVAILABLE IN PRIVATE NUISANCE
3	ACTIONS AGAINST AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTRY OPERATIONS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Article 57 of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new section to read:
7	"§ 106-702. Limitations on private nuisance actions against agricultural and forestry
8	operations.
9	(a) The compensatory damages that may be awarded to a plaintiff for a private nuisance
10	action where the alleged nuisance emanated from an agricultural or forestry operation shall be
11	<u>as follows:</u>
12	(1) If the nuisance is a permanent nuisance, compensatory damages shall be
13	measured by the reduction in the fair market value of the plaintiff's property
14	caused by the nuisance, but not to exceed the fair market value of the
15	property.
16	(2) If the nuisance is a temporary nuisance, compensatory damages shall be
17	limited to the diminution of the fair rental value of the plaintiff's property
18	caused by the nuisance.
19	(b) If any plaintiff or plaintiff's successor in interest brings a subsequent private
20	nuisance action against any agricultural or forestry operation, the combined recovery from all
21	such actions shall not exceed the fair market value of his or her property. This limitation
22	applies regardless of whether the subsequent action or actions were brought against a different
23	defendant than the preceding action or actions.
24	(c) This Article shall apply to any private nuisance claim brought against any party
25	based on that party's contractual or business relationship with an agricultural or forestry
26	operation.
27	(d) This Article does not apply to any cause of action brought against an agricultural or
28	forestry operation for negligence, trespass, personal injury, strict liability, or other cause of
29	action for tort liability other than nuisance, nor does this Article prohibit or limit any request
30	for injunctive relief or punitive damages that are otherwise available."
31	<b>SECTION 2.(a)</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to causes of
32	action commenced or brought on or after that date.
33	<b>SECTION 2.(b)</b> If any section or provision of this act is declared unconstitutional
34	or invalid by the courts, it does not affect the validity of this act as a whole or any part other
35	than the part declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.
