General Assembly Of North Carolina

After the expiration of the three-year period following discharge or death as 1 (d) 2 described in 38 U.S.C. § 3679(c), any enrolled veteran entitled to federal educational benefits 3 under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33 and any other enrolled individual 4 described in subsection (c) of this section entitled to federal educational benefits under 38 5 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33 who is eligible for in-State tuition under this section shall continue to be eligible for the in-State tuition rate so long as the covered individual 6 7 remains continuously enrolled (other than during regularly scheduled breaks between courses, 8 quarters, terms, or semesters) at that institution of higher education."

9 **SECTION 5.** Section 4 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2017. The remainder 10 of this act is effective when it becomes law. Sections 1 and 2 of this act apply beginning with 11 the 2017 fall academic semester.
