1 School Scores and Grades. - The State Board of Education shall award school (a) 2 achievement, growth, and performance scores and an associated performance grade as required 3 by G.S. 115C-12(9)c1., and calculated as provided in this section. The State Board of 4 Education shall enter all necessary data into the Education Value Added Assessment System 5 (EVAAS) in order to calculate school performance scores and grades.

7 Calculation of the School Growth Score as a Measure of School Quality and Student (c) 8 Success. – Using EVAAS, the Education Value-Added Assessment System (EVAAS), the State 9 Board shall calculate the overall growth score earned by schools as a measure of school quality 10 and student success. In calculating the total growth score earned by schools, the State Board of 11 Education shall weight student growth on the achievement indicators as provided in subsection (b) of this section that have available growth values. The numerical values used to determine 12 13 whether a school has met, exceeded, or has not met expected growth shall be translated to a 14 100-point scale and used for school reporting purposes as provided in G.S. 115C-12(9)c1., 15 115C-218.65, 115C-238.66, and 116-239.8.

16 Calculation of the Overall School Performance Scores and Grades. - The State (d) 17 Board of Education shall-use EVAAS to calculate the overall school performance score by 18 adding the school achievement score, as provided in subsection (b) of this section, and the 19 school growth score, as determined using EVAAS as provided in subsection (c) of this section, 20 earned by a school. The school achievement score shall account for eighty percent (80%), and 21 the school growth score shall account for twenty percent (20%) of the total sum. For all 22 schools, the total school performance score shall be converted to a 100-point scale and used to 23 determine an overall school performance grade. The overall school performance grade shall be 24 based on the following scale and shall not be modified to add any other designation related to 25 other performance measures, such as a "plus" or "minus":

27 (d2)Calculation of the School Performance Scores and Grades for Certain Subgroups of 28 Students Served by a School. – In addition to the overall school performance scores and grades 29 awarded under this section, for each school that serves a minimum number of students in a 30 subgroup of students listed in subsection (d1) of this section, the State Board of Education shall 31 use EVAAS to calculate school performance scores and shall determine a corresponding school 32 performance grade for each subgroup using the same method as set forth in subsection (d) of 33 this section.
