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RENEWAL NOT REQUIRED FOR HANDICAPPED PLACARD AFTER AGE 80

SECTION 4. G.S. 20-37.6(c1) reads as rewritten:

6 "(c1) Application and Renewal; Medical Certification. – The initial application for a 7 distinguishing license plate, removable windshield placard, or temporary removable windshield 8 placard shall be accompanied by a certification of a licensed physician, a licensed 9 ophthalmologist, a licensed optometrist, a licensed physician assistant, a licensed nurse 10 practitioner, or the Division of Services for the Blind that the applicant is handicapped or by a 11 disability determination by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs that the applicant 12 is handicapped. For an initial application for a temporary removable windshield placard only, the 13 certification that the applicant is handicapped may be made by a licensed certified nurse midwife. 14 The application for a temporary removable windshield placard shall contain additional 15 certification to include the period of time the certifying authority determines the applicant will 16 have the disability. Distinguishing license plates shall be renewed annually, but subsequent 17 applications shall not require a medical certification that the applicant is handicapped. 18 Removable windshield placards shall be renewed every five years, and, except for a person 19 certified as totally and permanently disabled at the time of the initial application or a prior 20 renewal under this subsection, the renewal shall require a medical recertification that the person 21 is handicapped.handicapped; provided that renewal shall not be required for any placard that 22 expires after the person to whom it is issued is 80 years of age and the placard shall remain valid. 23 Temporary removable windshield placards shall expire no later than six months after issuance." 24
