The applicant verifies, by affidavit submitted to the Division of Health Service 15 **(2)** 16 Regulation within 60 days after the effective date of this act, that the facility 17 was in operation as of the effective date of this act or that the completed 18 application for the building permit for the facility was submitted by the 19 effective date of this act. 20 <u>(3)</u> The facility has been accredited by The Accreditation Association for 21 Ambulatory Health Care, The Joint Commission, or The American 22 Association for Accreditation of Ambulatory Surgical Facilities by the time 23 the license application is postmarked for delivery to the Division of Health 24 Service Regulation of the Department. 25 (4) 26

The license application includes a commitment to and a plan for serving indigent and medically underserved populations.

All other persons proposing to obtain a license to establish an ambulatory surgical facility for the provision of vascular access site management shall be required to obtain a certificate of need. The annual State Medical Facilities Plan shall not include policies or need determinations that limit the number of vascular access procedure rooms that may be approved.

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SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2019.

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
