5	Whereas, the General Assembly finds that the number of deaths resulting from			
6	opioid-related overdoses has drastically increased over the past 20 years; and			
7	Whereas, the General Assembly finds that the number of deaths resulting from			
8	opioid-related overdoses is unlikely to be reduced so long as the drug continues to be made			
9	available through illegal distribution by drug dealers; and			
10	Whereas, the General Assembly finds that the legal distribution of opioids should			
11	only be through a prescription issued for a legitimate medical purpose by an individual			
12	practitioner acting in the usual course of his or her professional practice; and			
13	Whereas, it is the intent of the General Assembly to strengthen the laws to act as a			
14	greater deterrent to persons who want to illegally distribute opioids and further exacerbate the			
15	opioid epidemic; Now, therefore,
