Article 28C of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes reads as rewritten: 6 "Article 28C. 7 "Grade "A" Milk and Raw Milk Sanitation. 8 "§ 106-266.30. Definitions. 9 The following definitions shall apply throughout this Article: "Grade 'A' milk" means fluid milk and milk products which have been 10 (1)11 produced, transported, handled, processed and distributed in accordance with 12 the provisions of the rules adopted by the Board of Agriculture. 13 "Milk" means the lacteal secretion practically free from colostrum obtained (2)by the milking of one or more cows, goats, or other lactating animals. 14 "Raw milk" means fluid milk that has not been pasteurized. 15 (3) "Small herd operation" means a dairy farm with a herd of no more than ten 16 (4) 17 lactating cows, ten lactating goats, or ten lactating sheep. The total size of the small herd may not exceed ten animals of any species. The dairy farm herd 18 may include other cows, goats, or sheep that are dry or are producing milk for 19 20 purposes other than raw milk for human consumption. 21 22 "§ 106-266.31A. Standards for raw milk. 23 Raw milk intended for human consumption, except for raw milk that is dispensed to the 24 independent or partial owner of a cow, goat, or other lactating animal for the owner's personal 25 use or consumption, shall be produced and processed to conform with all of the following 26 standards: 27 The raw milk shall be cooled to 40 degrees Fahrenheit or less within two hours (1) 28 after milking, provided that the blend temperature after the first and 29 subsequent milking does not exceed 45 degrees Fahrenheit. Raw milk, except cultured raw milk products, shall contain no more than 30 (2)31 10,000 bacteria per milliliter. 32 Raw milk shall contain no more than 10 coliform bacteria per milliliter. (3) The somatic cell count of bovine raw milk shall not exceed 300,000 cells per 33 (4) 34 milliliter. Goat or sheep raw milk shall not exceed 750,000 cells per milliliter. 35 Milk from commingled species must meet the somatic cell count of the most 36 restrictive species.

40	remove or dispose of the detained or embargoed milk without that permission.

supervision of the petitioner or the petitioner shall ensure that the milk will not be used for human 46 47 consumption as Grade "A" milk. milk or raw milk. All court costs and fees, storage, expenses of

If, the milk, by proper labelling or processing, can be properly branded and will satisfy the milk 49

50 sanitation rules adopted pursuant to G.S. 106-266.31, G.S. 106-266.31 or the raw milk standards

51 provided in G.S. 106-266.31A, the court, after the payment of all costs, fees, and expenses and

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1 after the claimant posts an adequate bond, may order that the milk be delivered to the claimant

2 for proper labelling and processing under the supervision of the petitioner. The bond shall be

3 returned to the claimant after the petitioner represents to the court either that the milk is no longer

4 mislabelled mislabeled or in violation of the milk sanitation rules adopted pursuant to

5 G.S. 106-266.31, G.S. 106-266.31 or the raw milk standards provided in G.S. 106-266.31A, or

6 that the milk will not be used for human consumption, and that in either case the expenses of

7 supervision have been paid."
