1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTENDED TEACHER CONTRACTS, TO 3 REQUIRE COMPLETION OF AN ECONOMICS AND PERSONAL FINANCE COURSE 4 AS A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS, TO 5 CLARIFY REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL CIVIC LITERACY, AND TO REQUIRE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR ECONOMICS AND PERSONAL 6 7 FINANCE TEACHERS. 8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9 SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 115C-325.3 reads as rewritten: 10 "§ 115C-325.3. Teacher contracts. 11 Length of Contract. – A contract between the local board of education and a teacher (a) who has been employed by the local board of education for less than three years shall be for a 12 term of one school year. A new contract or renewal of contract between the local board of 13 education and a teacher who has been employed by the local board of education as a teacher for 14 15 three years or more shall be for a term of one, two, or four school years. A local board of 16 education may require by policy that the three years of employment be consecutive. Determination of Years of Employment. -17 (a1) 18 (1)For purposes of determining whether a teacher has been employed for three years by a local board of education under this section, a year shall not be less 19 20 than 120 workdays performed as a teacher in a full-time permanent position. If a local board of education requires by policy that the three years of 21 (2)22 employment be consecutive, the local board policy shall state that if the teacher in a full-time permanent position did not work for at least 120 23 24 workdays as a teacher in a year because the teacher was on approved or legally entitled leave, that year shall not (i) be deemed to constitute a year of 25 employment for the teacher nor (ii) be considered a break in the continuity of 26 consecutive years of employment for the teacher. A suspension shall not 27 constitute approved or legally entitled leave for the purposes of this section. 28 Teachers may have additional rights to the extent required by the federal 29 30 Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, 34 U.S.C. 31 § 4301, et seq." 32 33 **SECTION 1.(b)** This section applies to contracts executed on or after that date.
