5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by adding			
7	a new section to read as follows:			
8	" <u>§ 143-128.5. Preference for qualified disabled veteran businesses.</u>			
9			tions. – For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:	
10	<u></u>	(1)	Qualified disabled veteran. – A veteran with a disability rating of sixty percent	
11			(60%) or higher, for a service-connected disability.	
12		<u>(2)</u>	Qualified disabled veteran-owned business. – A business that is one hundred	
13			percent (100%) owned by one or more qualified disabled veterans; provided,	
14			however, a spouse of a qualified disabled veteran business owner may have	
15			an ownership interest in that business, as long as the ownership interest of the	
16			qualified disabled veterans is no less than fifty percent (50%).	
17		<u>(3)</u>	Service-connected disability A disability incurred in the line of duty in	
18			active military, naval, or air service.	
19		<u>(4)</u>	Veteran. – As defined in G.S. 128-15(b)(2).	
20			hent of Preference. – It is the policy of this State to encourage and promote the	
21	use of qualified disabled veteran-owned businesses in State construction or repair contracts			
22	requiring an expenditure of public money, while maintaining the lowest cost to the State. All State agencies, departments, and institutions shall cooperate with the Department of

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1	(d) Eligibility Determination. – In order to be considered for the preference, the qualified		
2	disabled veteran-owned business must be a responsible, responsive bidder. Additionally, each		
3	qualified disabled veteran-owned business shall include in its bid all of the following:		
4	(1) Proof of service and conditions of discharge in the form of a DD Form 214		
5	and Department of Veterans Affairs claim decision letter.		
6	(2) Proof of a service-connected disability in the form of a DD Form 214, if the		
7	disability was documented at the time of discharge, or a Department of		
8	Veterans Affairs rating decision letter, if the disability was documented after		
9	discharge.		
10	(3) Proof of legal ownership of the business, and proof that the business is		
11	properly registered with the North Carolina Secretary of State's Office.		
12	(e) <u>Missing Documentation. – A bid that fails to include the documentation required</u>		
13	under subsection (d) of this section may be eligible for consideration for the contract but will not		
14	be eligible for the preference authorized under this section.		
15	(f) Loss of Preference Qualification. – If a qualified disabled veteran-owned business		
16	awarded a contract under this section fails to maintain the status of a qualified disabled		
17	veteran-owned business, the contract shall continue to be performed; however, that business will		
18	not be eligible to apply for the preference in the future."		
19	<b>SECTION 2.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
20	Administration, State Construction Office, the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in		
21	nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act.		
22	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2019, and applies to State		
23	construction or repair contract bids submitted on or after that date.
