# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REOUIRE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO ENTER MISSING CHILD, MISSING PERSONS, OR UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS INFORMATION INTO THE

- NATIONAL MISSING AND UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS SYSTEM AFTER THIRTY DAYS HAVE PASSED AND THE PERSON HAS NOT BEEN FOUND OR IDENTIFIED. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- SECTION 1. Subpart B of Part 5 of Article 13 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:

## "Subpart B. North Carolina Center for Missing Persons.

#### "§ 143B-1011. Definitions. 11

For the purpose of this Part:
