2 AN ACT TO MODIFY THE REPORTING REQUIREMENT RELATED TO 3 GENDER-PROPORTIONATE APPOINTMENTS TO CERTAIN BOARDS AND 4 COMMISSIONS.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 143-157.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143-157.1. Reports on gender-proportionate appointments to statutorily created decision-making regulatory certain public bodies.

9 Appointments. – In appointing members to public bodies set forth in subsections (c) (a) 10 (b) and (d) of this section, the appointing authority should select, from among the most qualified persons, those persons whose appointment would promote membership on the body that 11 accurately reflects the proportion that each gender represents in the population of the State as a 12 whole or, in the case of a local body, in the population of the area represented by the body, as 13 determined pursuant to the most recent federal decennial census, unless the law regulating the 14 15 appointment requires otherwise. If there are multiple appointing authorities for the body, they 16 may consult with each other to accomplish the purposes of this section.

(b) Reports Generally. Each appointing authority described in subsection (a) of this

<u>(b2)</u> Use of Prescribed Form. – The Secretary of State shall prescribe the form to be used
to report these appointments for submitting reports required under subsections (b) and (d) of this
<u>section</u> and <u>may-shall</u> accept these-reports by <u>in an</u> electronic means. Reports by appointing
authorities shall be due in the Department of the Secretary of State on or before September 1.
