1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT RELATING TO SEIZURE DISORDERS IN SCHOOLS.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known as the "Seizure Safe Schools Act of 2019" or  
5 "Sam's Law" and may be cited by those names.

6 **SECTION 2.** Article 25A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by  
7 adding a new section to read:

8 "**§ 115C-375.7. Seizures.**

9 (a) Definitions. – For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply:

10 (1) Parent. – A parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian of a student.

11 (2) Public school unit. – Any of the following:

12 a. A local school administrative unit.

13 b. A charter school.

14 c. A regional school.

15 d. A school providing elementary or secondary instruction operated by  
16 one of the following:

17 1. The State Board of Education, including schools operated  
18 under Article 7A and Article 9C of this Chapter.

19 2. The University of North Carolina, including schools operated  
20 under Article 4, Article 29, and Article 29A of Chapter 116 of  
21 the General Statutes.

22 (3) School. – A school within a public school unit.

23 (4) Seizure action plan. – A written, individualized health plan between a school  
24 and the parent of a student in the school who is diagnosed with a seizure  
25 disorder. The plan acknowledges the health care needs of the student, prepares  
26 both parties to meet those needs, and applies over the course of a school year.

27 (b) Seizure Action Plan. – The parent of any student may petition a school for the  
28 development of a seizure action plan if the student is (i) diagnosed with a seizure disorder and  
29 (ii) enrolled in the school. The school shall keep each seizure action plan on file in the office of  
30 a school administrator or school nurse employed by the public school unit and make the plan  
31 available to any school personnel and, with the permission of the student's parent, any volunteer  
32 responsible for the supervision of the student. The parent and the school shall develop the seizure  
33 action plan in accordance with policies and procedures developed by the governing body of the  
34 public school unit. At a minimum, the plan shall include the following components:



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- 1           (1) A written statement from the student's health care provider with all of the  
2 following information:  
3           a. The student's name.  
4           b. Any seizure medication prescribed to the student.  
5           c. The dosage and method of administering the seizure medication.  
6           d. The frequency of administration of the seizure medication.  
7           e. The symptoms necessitating administration of the seizure medication.  
8           (2) A written statement from the parent indicating whether trained school  
9 personnel or volunteers are permitted to administer the seizure medication to  
10 the student in the applicable school year. This permission shall be renewed in  
11 each subsequent school year the student attends the school.  
12           (3) If the written statement permits trained school personnel or volunteers to  
13 administer the seizure medication to the student, the written statement shall  
14 require that the parent will provide the school with at least one unopened  
15 dosage of the medication with an intact pharmaceutical label.  
16           (4) A requirement that the school shall store the medication in a safe and secure  
17 location accessible only by school personnel or volunteers with training to  
18 administer seizure medication in accordance with subsection (c) of this  
19 section.

20           (c) Employee Training and Administration of Seizure Medication. – Each school shall  
21 ensure that at least one employee in the school is trained to administer or assist with the  
22 self-administration of any seizure medication provided to the school pursuant to subsection (b)  
23 of this section. The governing body of each public school unit shall adopt minimum training  
24 requirements for these employees and for any volunteer that may supervise students with seizure  
25 disorders if the volunteer elects to receive the training. A volunteer shall not administer or assist  
26 with the self-administration of any seizure medication if the volunteer has not met the training  
27 requirements adopted by the governing body of the public school unit. The training requirements  
28 shall be consistent with training guidelines established by the Epilepsy Foundation of America,  
29 Inc., or its successor.

30           (d) Seizure Education Program. – The governing body of each public school unit shall  
31 adopt a policy outlining the requirements of a seizure education program for all school personnel  
32 having direct contact with students in grades kindergarten through 12. The seizure education  
33 program shall be administered on an annual basis in each school and, at a minimum, meet the  
34 following requirements:

- 35           (1) Provide instructions in administering seizure medications.  
36           (2) Educate on the signs and symptoms of seizures and the appropriate steps to be  
37 taken to respond to symptoms of a seizure.  
38           (3) Be consistent with guidelines established by the Epilepsy Foundation of  
39 America, Inc., or its successor.

40           (e) Self-Study Requirement. – The governing body of each public school unit shall adopt  
41 a policy requiring all principals, guidance counselors, and teachers to complete at least one hour  
42 of self-study review of seizure disorder materials each school year. The governing body of each  
43 public school unit shall select the materials for study in accordance with current practices and  
44 standards.

45           (f) Informational Poster. – The governing body of each public school unit shall ensure  
46 that an informational display on seizure first aid is posted in at least one visible, high-traffic area  
47 in each school.

48           (g) Limitation on Liability. – No governing body of any public school unit, nor its  
49 members, employees, designees, agents, or volunteers, shall be liable in civil damages to any  
50 party for any act authorized by this section or for any omission relating to that act, unless that act  
51 or omission amounts to gross negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing."

1           **SECTION 3.(a)** G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

2           "(47) Duty Regarding Seizures. – The State Board of Education shall adopt a rule  
3           regarding seizures in accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7 for all schools  
4           operated under the control of the State Board of Education."

5           **SECTION 3.(b)** G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

6           "(64) Duty Regarding Seizures. – Each local board of education shall adopt a policy  
7           regarding seizures in accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7 and the rule adopted  
8           by the State Board of Education pursuant to G.S. 115C-12(47)."

9           **SECTION 3.(c)** G.S. 115C-218.75 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

10          "(g) Seizure Policy. – A charter school shall adopt a policy regarding seizures in  
11          accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7 and the rule adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant  
12          to G.S. 115C-12(47)."

13          **SECTION 3.(d)** G.S. 115C-238.66 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

14          "(14) Seizure policy. – A regional school shall adopt a policy regarding seizures in  
15          accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7 and the rule adopted by the State Board of  
16          Education pursuant to G.S. 115C-12(47)."

17          **SECTION 3.(e)** G.S. 116-11 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

18          "(12f) The Board of Governors shall adopt a policy regarding seizures in accordance  
19          with G.S. 115C-375.7 for all schools operated under the control of the Board  
20          of Governors and the rule adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant  
21          to G.S. 115C-12(47)."

22          **SECTION 3.(f)** Article 39 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by  
23          adding two new sections to read:

24          "**§ 115C-548.5. Seizure policy.**

25                 Each private church school or school of religious charter is encouraged to adopt a policy  
26                 regarding seizures in accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7.

27          ...

28          "**§ 115C-556.5. Seizure policy.**

29                 Each qualified nonpublic school is encouraged to adopt a policy regarding seizures in  
30                 accordance with G.S. 115C-375.7."

31          **SECTION 3.(g)** G.S. 115C-564 reads as rewritten:

32          "**§ 115C-564. Qualifications and requirements.**

33                 A home school shall make the election to operate under the qualifications of either Part 1 or  
34                 Part 2 of this Article and shall meet the requirements of the Part elected, except that any  
35                 requirement related to safety and sanitation inspections shall be waived if the school operates in  
36                 a private residence and except that testing requirements in G.S. 115C-549 and G.S. 115C-557  
37                 shall be on an annual basis. A home school also shall be exempt from the requirements of  
38                 G.S. 115C-375.7. The persons providing academic instruction in a home school shall hold at least  
39                 a high school diploma or its equivalent."

40          **SECTION 4.** If House Bill 57, 2019 Regular Session, becomes law, then  
41          G.S. 115C-375.7(a)(2), as enacted by this act, is repealed.

42          **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with  
43          the 2020-2021 school year.
