8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

10	PART I. AUTHORIZATION TO REORGANIZE THE NORTH CAROLINA
11	COMMUNITY COLLEGES SYSTEM OFFICE
12	SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 115D-3 reads as rewritten:
13	"§ 115D-3. Community Colleges System Office; staff.staff; reorganization authority.
14	(a) The Community Colleges System Office shall be a principal administrative
15 16	department of State government under the direction of the State Board of Community Colleges, and shall be separate from the free public school system of the State, the State Board of
10	Education, and the Department of Public Instruction. The State Board has authority to adopt and
18	administer all policies, regulations, and standards which it deems necessary for the operation of
19	the System Office.
20	The State Board shall elect a President of the North Carolina System of Community Colleges
21	who shall serve as chief administrative officer of the Community Colleges System Office. The
22	compensation of this position shall be fixed by the State Board from funds provided by the
23	General Assembly in the Current Operations Appropriations Act.
24	The President shall be assisted by such professional staff members as may be deemed
25	necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter, who shall be elected by the State Board on

The compensation of the staff members elected by the Board sha be fixed by the State Board of Community Colleges, upon recommendation of the President of the Community College System, from funds provided in the Current Operations Appropriation Act. These staff members shall include such officers as may be deemed desirable by the Presider and State Board. Provision shall be made for persons of high competence and strong professional experience in such areas as academic affairs, public service programs, business and financial affairs, institutional studies and long-range planning, student affairs, research, legal affairs health affairs and institutional development, and for State and federal programs administered b the State Board. In addition, the President shall be assisted by such other employees as may be needed to carry out the provisions of this Chapter, who shall be subject to the provisions of

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(3) Awards criteria. – The State Board of Community Colleges shall develop criteria for consideration in determining the award of funds that shall include				
the following:				
a. Consideration of the workforce needs of business and industry in the				
region.				
b. Targeting of resources to enhance ongoing economic activity within				
the community college service area and surrounding counties.				
c. Geographic diversity of awards."				
<b>SECTION 2.(b)</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community				
Colleges System Office the sum of one million seven hundred thirty-three thousand four hundred				
thirteen dollars (\$1,733,413) in recurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and the sum of an				
additional five hundred sixty-six thousand five hundred eighty-seven dollars (\$566,587) in				
recurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to implement the requirements of subsection (a) of this section and to place additional career coaches employed by local community colleges with				
partnering high schools.				
<b>SECTION 2.(c)</b> If any provision of this section and G.S. 143C-5-4 are in conflict,				
the provisions of this section shall prevail.				
<b>SECTION 2.(d)</b> The appropriations and the authorizations to allocate and spend				
funds which are set out in this section shall remain in effect until the Current Operations				
Appropriations Act for the applicable fiscal year becomes law, at which time that act shall				
become effective and shall govern appropriations and expenditures. When the Current				
Operations Appropriations Act for that fiscal year becomes law, the Director of the Budget shall				
adjust allotments to give effect to that act from July 1 of the fiscal year.				
<b>SECTION 2.(e)</b> This section becomes effective July 1, 2019.				
PART III. EFFECTIVE DATE				
<b>SECTION 3.</b> Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes				
law.
