General Assembly Of North Carolina 1 **SECTION 2.(a)** G.S. 143B-1406(d) reads as rewritten: 2 Use of Funds. – A PSAP that receives a distribution from the 911 Fund may not use 3 the amount received to pay for the lease or purchase of real estate, cosmetic remodeling of 4 emergency dispatch centers, hiring or compensating telecommunicators, or the purchase of 5 mobile communications vehicles, ambulances, fire engines, or other emergency vehicles. 6 Distributions received by a PSAP may be used only to pay for the following: 7 The lease, purchase, or maintenance of: (1) 8 Emergency telephone equipment, including necessary computer 9 hardware, software, and database provisioning. 10 Addressing. b. 11 Telecommunicator furniture. c. Training outside the State is not 34 an eligible expenditure unless the training is unavailable in the State or the 35 PSAP documents that the training costs are less if received out-of-state. 36 Training specific to the receipt of 911 calls is allowed only for intake and 37 related call taking quality assurance and improvement. Instructor certification 38 costs and course required prerequisites, including physicals, psychological 39 exams, and drug testing, are not allowable expenditures. 40 Charges associated with the service supplier's 911 service and other service (4) 41 42 43

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supplier recurring charges. The PSAP providing 911 service is responsible to the communications service provider for all 911 installation, service, equipment, operation, and maintenance charges owed to the communications service provider. A PSAP may contract with a communications service provider on terms agreed to by the PSAP and the provider."

SECTION 2.(b) G.S. 143B-1400 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

"(19a) Military secondary PSAP. – A military PSAP that is able to receive the voice and data of a 911 call and to complete the call taking process dispatching law enforcement, medical, fire, or other responders in coordination with the primary PSAP."

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- **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law. Sections 1(a) and 1(b) apply to scholarships awarded beginning with the 2019-2020 academic year. Sections 2(a) and 2(b) apply to distributions for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and subsequent fiscal years.
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
