February 14, 2019 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO EXPAND THE PROHIBITION ON THE REMOVAL, DESTRUCTION, OR 3 DRIVING THROUGH OF ROADWAY CONSTRUCTION BARRIERS TO INCLUDE 4 DANGEROUS ROADWAY CONDITION CLOSURE BARRIERS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 SECTION 1. G.S. 136-26 reads as rewritten: 7 "§ 136-26. Closing of State transportation infrastructure during construction; construction 8 or for dangerous conditions; driving through, removal, injury to barriers, 9 warning signs, etc. 10 If it shall appear necessary to the Department of Transportation, its officers, or appropriate 11 employees, to close any transportation infrastructure coming under its jurisdiction so as to permit 12 proper completion of construction work which is being performed, or to prohibit traffic on 13 transportation infrastructure due to damage posing a danger to public safety, the Department of Transportation, its officers or employees, may close, or cause to be closed, the whole or any 14 portion of transportation infrastructure deemed necessary to be excluded from public travel. 15 While any transportation infrastructure, or portion thereof, is so closed, or while any 16 17 transportation infrastructure, or portion thereof, is in process of construction or maintenance, the Department of Transportation, its officers or appropriate employees, or its contractor, under 18 19 authority from the Department of Transportation, may erect, or cause to be erected, suitable 20 barriers or obstruction thereon; may post, or cause to be posted, conspicuous notices to the effect that the transportation infrastructure, or portion thereof, is closed; and may place warning signs, 21 lights and lanterns on transportation infrastructure, or portions thereof. When infrastructure is 22 23 closed to the public or in process of construction or maintenance, as provided herein, any person 24 who willfully drives into new construction work, breaks down, onto transportation infrastructure 25 closed pursuant to this section or removes, injures or destroys any such barrier or barriers or 26 obstructions on the road closed or being constructed, or tears down, removes or destroys any such notices, or extinguishes, removes, injures or destroys any such warning lights signs, lights, 27 or lanterns so erected, posted or placed, posted, or placed pursuant to this section, shall be guilty 28 29 of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 30 This prohibition does not apply to law enforcement, first responders, personnel of emergency management agencies, or Department of Transportation personnel acting in the course of, and 31 32 within the scope of, their official duties; or personnel acting in the course of, and within the scope 33 of, installation, restoration or maintenance of utility services in coordination with the Department 34 of Transportation."

35 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses
36 committed on or after that date.



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
